Our services are focused on educating both men and women on everything related to pregnancy and parenting.

- **The Three-Fold Definition of Discipleship:**

1. Be with Jesus
2. Become like Jesus
3. Do what Jesus did

Message Reflection Questions

1. When you hear the word "discipleship," what are some thoughts that come to your mind? What is discipleship all about?

2. Who has poured into your life in order that you might follow Jesus and grow in His ways. How did they go about doing this?

3. In his message on Sunday, Pastor Kurt said something like this: "Some people desire to receive salvation without desiring the experience of transformation." Why is it that some people are glad to get saved, but less interested in being changed? Is this an attitude that is okay with God?

4. Why do you think discipleship is so important to God? Why does, as 2 Peter 1:3 says, God supply us with all we need for a goldy and productive life?

5. What does God provide us with to see that we become disciples?

6. For discipleship to get rolling, we will have to release control over areas of our life that Jesus wants to influence. Yet, giving up control is often difficult for us. Why is this? What does Mark 8:34-37 say about the importance of releasing our life to Jesus, rather than holding onto it?

7. In the Sunday message, Pastor Kurt shared a three-fold framework of what discipleship looks like in real life: (1) Being with Jesus, (2) Becoming like Jesus, and (3) Doing what Jesus did. What do these things look like in everyday life and why are they important components in our discipleship?

8. Talk about this quote from Bill Hull: "Discipleship isn't a program or an event; it's a way of life. It's not for a limited time, but for our whole life. Discipleship isn't for beginners alone; it's for all believers for every day of their life. Discipleship isn't just one of the things the church does; it is what the church does." — (From "The Complete Book of Discipleship: On Being and Making Followers of Christ.")
