## Mark & Cynara Parris– South Africa

### *In Touch Mission International*

As parts of the world seem to be making great progress with vaccinations, we are now seeing more of our younger church members infected and hospitalized. Even though we are now allowed to gather at church with groups of up to 50 people, so many people are having to stay at home isolating because they have been in contact with someone who has recently tested positive.

The struggle is to keep moving forward with several breaks in the momentum. Over and over our leaders have reminded our congregation that we refuse to slow down the work of the ministry. There is so much to be done! There are so many who are needing to hear and see the hope that we have in Christ. We thank God that through technology, we are able to share the truth with more people online than are able to currently meet in our venue.

At the end of July, we began a new partnership with a couple who have moved up north to start a student ministry. I had worked with him briefly when I first came to South Africa and was working at the University of Cape Town doing student ministry. He and his family have sold everything and moved to reach students at a new university which has very little Christian influence. We are committed to supporting individuals who are doing pioneer work, especially among the unreached. It has kept us focused on looking outwards instead of acting like victims.

A few months ago, there was widespread looting in South Africa. We didn't experience the violence in our suburbs, but there were violent outbursts in Khayelitsha where I work with one of our churches. Many trucks transporting food were burned and there was a shortage of food for quite some time in areas that suffered. We partnered with churches in our area and up north to ship food to the hungry. Thousands of jobs were lost because many shopping centers were destroyed. As a result, many are leaving the country and more people desperate for work are moving to Cape Town.

#### **Prayer Requests:**

For our church members to fill their minds with the scriptures instead of the despair that is all around. For wisdom in leading the church and ministries in Klipheuwel and Khayelitsha.

For my family as we care for my father-in-law who lost his job and is recovering after 3 months in hospital due to COVID. There is a great financial pressure as we are assisting him financially.

### Read 1 Peter 2:1-10

What does Peter say the followers of Jesus are being built up into (vs. 4-6)?  
What does this mean?

What does Peter say the purpose of our salvation is (vs. 9)?

### Read 1 Peter 2:11-17

What does Peter say the people of God in the world are like (vs. 11)?

How does Peter exhort these exiles to live in the lands they find themselves in (vs. 13-17)? How is this God's will (vs. 15)?
