Blessings in COVID Ministry

As the months have melted by this year, we have seen God moving and doing some great things. The opportunities for ministry during COVID are nothing like we ever expected 2020 to look like, but we are so grateful!

Eric has been able to pursue various avenues of ministry through Zoom, social media and study as well through planning and future vision casting with ministry partners. One of the biggest blessings has been the opportunity to work on his Association of Certified Biblical Counselors (ACBC) training. He has also been working on his biblical counseling classes in the doctoral program in Biblical counseling at Midwestern Theological Seminary. This is not just study in his office; he has spent countless hours counseling men over Zoom while being supervised. These are the first active steps towards much ministry here in Argentina, including counseling, teaching, and training Biblical counselors in our local seminary and through our local church. He is really excited about the doors that God is opening up in these areas.

Eric has also had the opportunity to encourage and teach virtually through his new Spanish theological podcast, Teología en tu Vida, jointly with our teammate, Jason Wright. Another teaching avenue has been through a daily audio devotional which goes out to our local church as well as to Christians throughout Argentina. He also taught on the Bible and depression through Instagram online with our college and career group at church.

Danica has also been blessed in different ways of doing ministry during COVID. She has been doing Bible study and discipling a few ladies weekly. She is working on her ACBC certification as well. Most of all, she loves her primary ministry of homeschooling the boys. It is a huge blessing to her to have the boys at home and teach them about life, learning, and the Word of God!

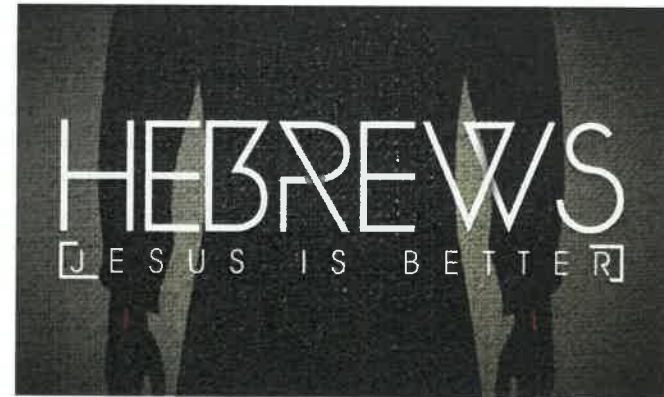

Daylight Savings Ends— Don't forget to turn your clocks back one hour on Sunday, November 1st. FALL BACK time is here again!

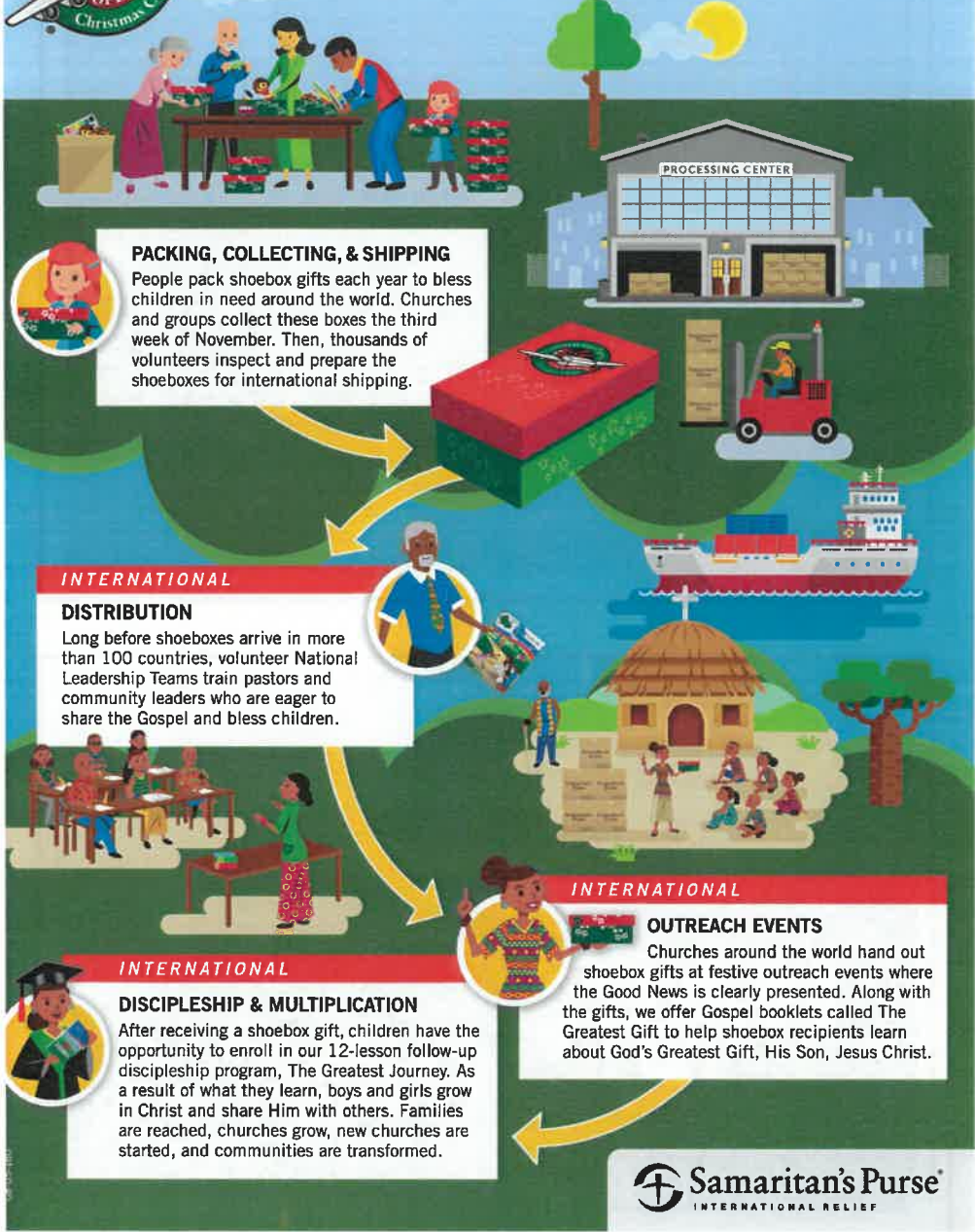

- What does this passage encourage believers to do? What does this passage challenge believers not to do?
- How does the writer of Hebrews try to make a comparison/strong point in verse 2 and the first line of verse 3? What proves we cannot escape judgment if we neglect our great salvation?
- How was this great salvation revealed and confirmed to us, according to the last part of verse 3 and verse 4?
- How might these verses be unnerving for a person? How might these same verses serve as a comforting challenge to others?
- What is the result if we drift away or neglect the truths of the gospel? How can you protect against this? Why should you protect against drifting away or neglecting the truths of the gospel?
