The Smyth Family Legacy

My Grandpa Smyth accepted Christ as his savior when he heard the gospel from a street preacher on skid row, in downtown Seattle. He began to follow the Lord with all his heart and immediately lost all desire for alcohol and tobacco. He developed such an incredible hunger for God's Word, he became a preacher and memorized so much scripture that some people called him a walking Bible.

Grandpa and Grandma Smyth were so pleased that both of their children went to serve the Lord as missionaries on the foreign field. Aunt Nancy went to Africa with Barbara Grimes, and my Dad took our family to Indonesia. All of us kids have followed the Lord faithfully.

When I was 18 years old, my parents were in the jungles of Borneo, taking the gospel to an unreached people group. One day I was walking with my Dad on a jungle airstrip and he said, *"Rusty, when you graduate high school I cannot give you a car, and I cannot pay your way through college. And when I die, I probably will not be able to give you an inheritance. But I want to give you what my father gave me, and that is a Godly heritage. I hope one day you will appreciate that."*

This is our family legacy; this is our heritage and inheritance. I would not trade it for fortune or fame; it is a treasure greater than any other. Like the Lord said to the Levites, *"You will not have land of your own, but I will be your inheritance."* Joshua 13:33

25 WAYS TO BUILD RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR NEIGHBORS

- 1.** Pray specifically for your neighbors. Ask God to create connections and open conversations. If you are introverted, ask him to give you courage and confidence.
- 2.** Be mindful of being a good neighbor yourself. Take care of your yard and home. Avoid activities and practices that could be viewed as negative in a neighborhood.
- 3.** Remember that your neighbors who don't know Jesus may sometimes act like people who don't know Jesus. Ask God to grow your heart for them, even if they sometimes are difficult or offensive. Maintain a tender, forgiving heart.
- 4.** Purpose to spend more time in your front yard or on your front porch, if you have either.
- 5.** Admire your neighbor's dogs or other pets. People usually love their pets and enjoy talking about them.
- 6.** Don't immediately shut your garage door when you come home. Look around outside to see if there is someone to greet or help.
- 7.** Share some baked goods with your neighbors. Holidays provide great opportunities to give the gift of cookies or bread.
- 8.** Have or attend block parties.
- 9.** Mow your neighbor's lawn or shovel their snow.
- 10.** Ask a neighbor out to dinner or lunch.
- 11.** Offer to bring in a neighbor's mail, newspaper or packages while they are away.
- 12.** Work hard at remembering names.
- 13.** Greet brand new neighbors with a smile and a small gift. Let them know you are willing to help them learn about their new community.
- 14.** Take walks around your neighborhood. Be sure to smile and wave at the people you encounter.
- 15.** At Halloween, be sure to be generous and friendly. This is the one night of the year when neighbors come out of their homes to connect. Don't miss it!
- 16.** Be aware of neighbors who are elderly and/or disabled. Make a connection and let them know you are available in case they find themselves in a predicament. Make sure they have your phone #.
- 17.** Be friendly to your neighborhood's children and teenagers. It's amazing how kids appreciate having a friendly neighbor, as they will likely encounter several who ignore them, or worse, treat them badly.
- 18.** Be willing to allow neighbors to borrow items: sugar, milk, eggs, tools, yard equipment.
- 19.** If you grow flowers and/or vegetables, share them with your neighbors.
- 20.** If you see a new family moving in, offer to help unload the moving truck.
- 21.** Offer compliments regarding your neighbor's landscaping or holiday decorations.
- 22.** Allow your neighbors to serve you as well. Express gratitude for their kindness.
- 23.** Build a sharing book library. Mix in some books that might pique interest in spiritual matters.
- 24.** Almost everyone hates raking leaves! Offer to rake leaves for neighbors who are elderly or very busy.
- 25.** Focus on the most promising relationships. While you should be friendly with all your neighbors, you can realistically only build close friendships with a few of them. Focus on investing most of your efforts on the few neighbors who prove to be the most open and responsive to you.
